Alexander Ostrovsky is an unknown continent in France. For me this piece is a world where all of humanity – and not only Russian humanity – is alive on stage. I feel an ardent, emotional wish to stage this theatre because the obscure and barbarian world from which the women in Ostrovsky's plays try to escape seems today ahead, and not behind us. Violently subdued and dominated, it is always the woman who in his plays is the mirror, a premonition or the matrix of a world to come, a brighter world that men seem to ignore, refuse, or which they desperately attempt to destroy.

The Storm is a five act drama on a great scale: the heroin, Katarina Kabanova gives way to her desire for a man and ends up committing suicide in the Volga. I intend to set it in the 19th Century, as if the play carried out a return to the origin, to Katarina's sacrificial act. The stage will be simple – at first indoors for the household comedy, water will creep in progressively to accompany the build-up of the drama, as if the storm, or successive storms, drenched the stage, invaded the indoors, waiting for Katarina's body.

Musicologists have of late made considerable efforts towards reinstating women composers into the history of music. Still often held in contempt or simply ignored, they have a lot to teach us. Louise Bertin is one of them.

But what does she stand for? Handicapped, criticised by the press and the critics of her time, Louise Bertin seems to have found her fictional double in the character of Esmeralda, harassed and despised by a group of men who, for different reasons, cannot tolerate her freedom.

Subsequent adaptations of Victor Hugo's novel have romanticised Quasimodo's, Phœbus' and Frollo's love for Esmeralda. But Hugo's libretto takes us back to the source of the story, and a contemporary reading of this so-called love becomes of essence.

This project came about from an encounter between Virginia Woolf's writing - which tirelessly explores the rapport of the body to the world – and Domenico Scarlatti's *Stabat Mater* - a rare gem of the baroque repertoire, never yet performed as a theatre piece, an amazing composition written for ten voices. The director, Maëlle Dequiedt, establishes a dialogue between this scene of a mother facing the cross with Wolf's tempestuous and liberating writing that shatters the narrow social frames and gives a hint of a terrifying freedom.

Simon-Pierre Bestion and his ensemble La Tempête freely re-visit Domenico Scarlatti's *Stabat Mater* turning it into a sensory experience. Even though it was commissioned by the Vatican for the Sistine Chapel, the *Stabat Mater* disobeys the summons and injunctions: it is directly related to and suffused with emotion and sensuality. The music is profoundly rooted in earth, full of desire, it calls out to the body. On stage, four actors and ten singers/musicians invite us on a journey through ages in a world deprived of our certainties, a plunge into the unknown, guided by Virginia Woolf's writing.

Jean Anouilh's *Trousers* (*La Culotte*) is a farce written in 1978. It seemed to me very appropriate to stage today this phantasmagorical nightmare, with Felliniesque echoes, that oscillates between a cruel joke and a bitter statement about a fallen society in loss of points of reference and moral conscience. Having taken over the power by force, women – who had so much suffered from masculine hegemony that had at times ruined them – intend to totally and irrevocably annihilate men. The intention is to use the carnivalesque ballet of this choral piece, carried by colourful and intensely theatrical characters, to denounce the madness of a system that reduces the individual to nothing, and thus throw a light on different stratagems of the survival instinct that each protagonist has developed according to their gender, their socio-professional category and their personal interest. Through humour and musical sketches added to the play in the spirit of the author in order to underline the sometimes lyrical, sometimes caustic character of the work, we will offer an image of a world that falters. For this the show will use a singular and timeless aesthetic that will point our attention towards the Sublime and the Grotesque, Monsters and Marvels that coexist with poetic force all through this visionary and daring ("culottée") play that Anouilh offers us.

This is why it is for me important to give them body on stage and unveil their great wealth, their complexity, their paradoxes and thus, hopefully, their truth.

The play received two Molière awards in May 2022: Stage direction (Valérie Lesort and Christian Hecq), Visual and sound creation

After Jules Verne's *20000 leagues under the sea*, and *The Fly*, freely adapted from George Langelaan's novel and David Cronenberg's film, Christian Hecq and Valérie Lesort present *Gulliver's Travel*, an adaptation of the famous fantasy adventure story by Jonathan Swift.

The only survivor of a shipwreck, Gulliver wakes up on the shore, besieged by tiny creatures who capture him and present him to the Emperor and his wife, the Empress Cachaça. A pacific giant, Gulliver observes the agitation of these people and the versatility of the mighty ones, their taste for power and war.

Christian Hecq and Valérie Lesort seize this social and political satire and turn it into a hymn to difference. The Lilliputians are hybrid marionettes: half actor, half marionette, little bodies with big heads, burlesque and ridiculous. Black box, object manipulation and visual inventions, in this bountiful story their universe deploys a wealth of imagination, sublimating its spicy and exhilarating irony.

How do (we) rebuild ourselves after a disaster? Samuel Achache crosses the patterns of collapse and rebirth, in a fragmentary piece worked with Schumann's Lieder, which continues to freely explore the links between theatre and music.

With no fanfare (Sans Tambour) is the story of the collapse that happens without warning of a house and the people who live there. From this situation Samuel Achache composes a piece in the form of paintings that recount several eras, from today to the Stone Age, and travels through the parts of life of those who lived in this house.

The plateau is a site in permanent deconstruction, made of strata of the past and traces of the present. The singing comes out of the ruins and the musical instruments from the rubble; each musician performer tries to reconstruct with what he remains, his distorted memory and his subjective memory.

Accompanied to the musical direction by Florent Hubert and a part of his collaborators, Samuel Achache returns to a very musical form that starts from the Lied as intimate form to work on the ensemble, having it carried by several voices.
